Enrolling in Illinois HIV Care Connect and the ADAP Medication Assistance Program (ADAP-MAP) will enable you to receive the care and support you need to live with HIV. Many people with HIV live full, busy lives in good health, thanks to improvements in treatment and access to care. Still, any person living with HIV must receive lifelong treatment, and ADAP-MAP can help to make your treatment more affordable.

Without proper treatment, HIV may lead to serious complications, AIDS, and other illnesses. By following your treatment regimen with the assistance of ADAP-MAP, you can improve your health and reduce the chances of transmitting HIV to someone else.

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ADAP-MAP will help pay for medications

The Illinois ADAP Medication Assistance Program (ADAP-MAP) helps pay for medications on the ADAP-MAP formulary that are needed by low-income Illinois residents living with HIV. ADAP-MAP supplements coverage provided by Medicare, Medicare supplemental (Medi-Gap), Medicaid, or market-place private commercial insurance plans, making HIV treatment much more affordable.

Enroll in Illinois HIV Care Connect to receive Illinois ADAP-MAP benefits and more

Once you are enrolled, the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) will determine your eligibility for ADAP-MAP. Illinois HIV Care Connect enrollees are eligible for free and confidential medical case management, as well as health care and other benefits that may include:

- Outpatient/ambulatory health care
- Mental health care • Oral health care
- Medical nutritional therapy
- Substance abuse services (outpatient)
- Food bank • Legal assistance
- Medical transportation • Psychosocial support
- Rehabilitation
- Utility and short-term rent assistance

Not all of the above services may be available, and the nature of services may vary, by regional office.

How does ADAP-MAP work?

ADAP-MAP provides a wide variety of medications approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to low-income individuals living with HIV. Physicians have used these drugs successfully to treat persons with HIV and to help them prolong their lives.

To be eligible for ADAP-MAP benefits, you must:

- Be diagnosed with HIV or AIDS.
- Supply CD4 and viral load laboratory results not older than 6 months prior to enrollment.
- Currently live in Illinois and have a legal home address (domicile) in Illinois.
- Have anticipated gross annual income at or below 300 percent of the federal poverty level for household size.
- Verify third-party payer sources, such as Medicaid, Medicare or other commercial/employer-based insurance if appropriate.

In addition, your health insurance company must participate with an ADAP-MAP-contracted pharmacy for dispensing and billing purposes.

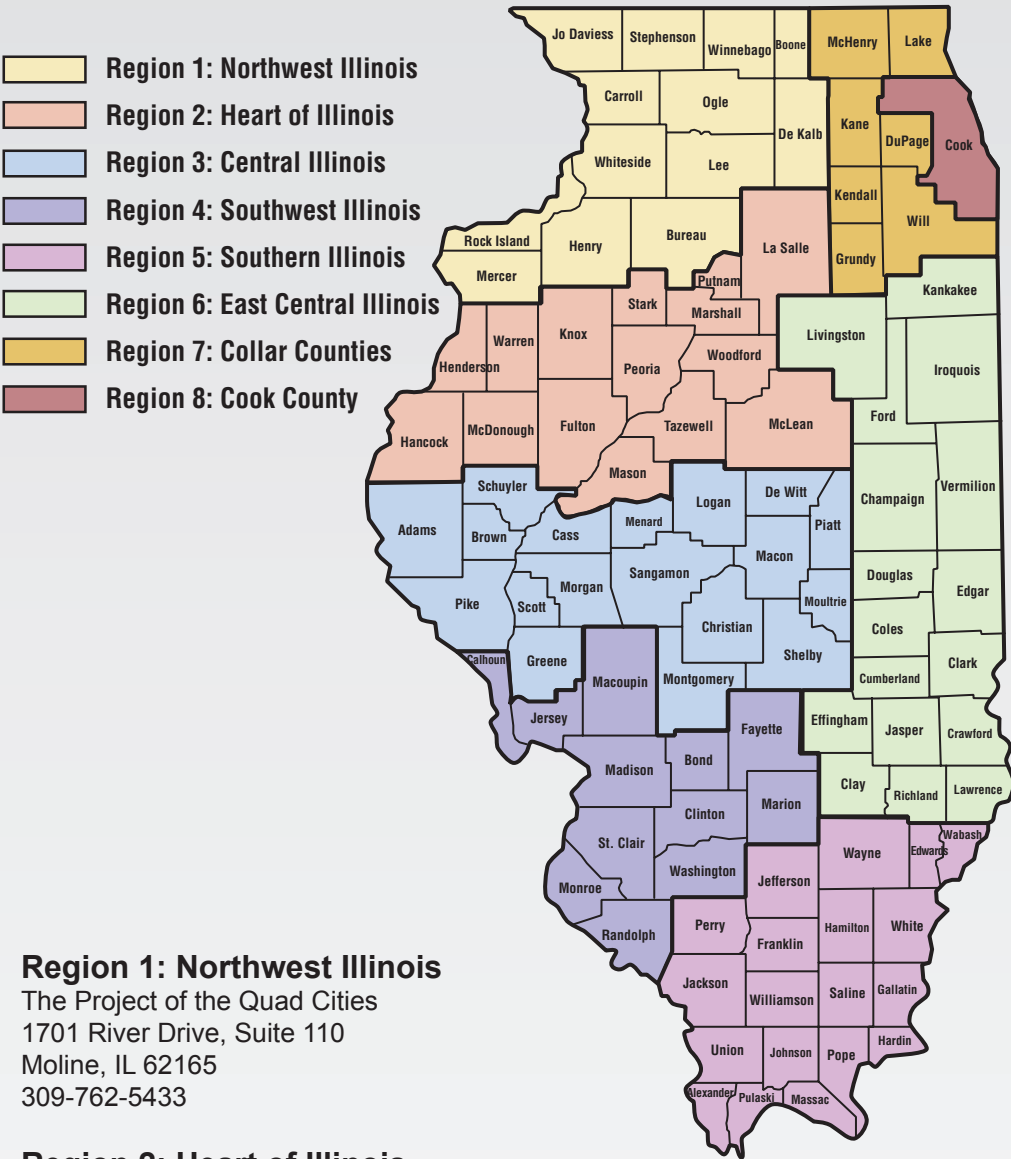
You are not eligible for ADAP-MAP benefits if you:

- Do not reside in Illinois or are not an Illinois resident.
- Do not meet income guidelines.
- Do not meet the documentation requirements for eligibility determination.

Any of the above excludes an individual from ADAP-MAP eligibility.
